WHEREAS, Governor Philip Murphy and the New Jersey State Legislature created RevolutionNJ in 2018 to plan, encourage, develop, and coordinate the commemoration of the 250th anniversary of the founding of the United States, New Jersey’s pivotal role in the American Revolution, and the contributions of its diverse peoples to the nation’s past, present, and future; and

WHEREAS, it is fitting and desirable that we commemorate the beginning of the Nation and the role New Jersey played over the past 250 years as well as its present and future role as part of the United States, with particular focus on the individuals, ideas, and events that shaped our Country, State, and Borough of East Newark; and

WHEREAS, RevolutionNJ will consider the role New Jersey played during the American Revolution when it saw more battles and skirmishes than any other state and was truly the Crossroads of the American Revolution; and

WHEREAS, RevolutionNJ will highlight the role New Jerseyans played beyond the battlefield during the American Revolution when people of diverse backgrounds contributed to the development of the State and the Nation in various ways and fought for the right to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness; and

WHEREAS, preserving, studying, and enjoying state history strengthens communities and builds bonds between New Jersey residents as we work together toward the goals of justice and equality embedded in the United States Constitution;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of East Newark hereby endorses RevolutionNJ and its mission to advance the role that history plays in public discourse, community engagement, education, tourism and scholarship in New Jersey.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that:

1. The Mayor and Borough Council commemorates the 250th anniversary of the establishment of the United States as an independent Nation.

ORDINANCE BOROUGH OF EAST NEWARK COUNTY OF HUDSON, STATE OF NEW JERSEY

ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF EAST NEWARK AMENDING CHAPTER 7 TITLED “TRAFFIC” SPECIFICALLY BY AMENDING § 7- 9 – “[RESERVED]” TO CREATE A SECTION TITLED “PAY-BY-APP PARKING”

§ 7-9 Pay-by-App.

§ 7-9.1 Definitions

As used in this chapter:

PAY-BY-APP PARKING

Shall mean Mobile Payment Applications, hereinafter referred to as "Pay-by-App," used as the form of parking control along with any parking meters and kiosks (if being used as parking control devices) and Pay-by-App shall be deemed to include all forms of parking control to be operated as stated herein.

§ 7-9.2 Establishment and Operation

- a. The Borough shall establish the use of a Pay-By-App through whatever agreements are necessary and implement same consistent with the provisions herein and shall provide reasonable notice to Borough residents prior to its implementation and to non-residents after its implementation as may be required.
- b. The Borough shall designate and delineate parking zones within the borders of the Borough and may establish different rates for parking for each zone.
- c. For credit/debit card payments used to pay the fees for parking through the Pay-By-App, the Borough is hereby authorized to charge a convenience fee not to exceed \$.50 per credit/debit card transaction.

- d. The Borough is hereby authorized to charge fees to park in the Borough in an amount not to exceed \$2.00 per hour, plus any applicable convenience fees, available in increments established through the Pay-By-App.

§ 7-9.3 Marking of Spaces; Manner of Parking

The Chief of Police (or his or her respective designee), or the Director of the Department of Public Works (or his or her respective designee), or other authorized Authority as designated by the Mayor is hereby authorized and instructed to have lines or markings painted or placed upon the curb or upon the street, or both, which controls that parking space for the purpose of designating the parking space for which the Pay-By-App is to be used and each vehicle parked adjacent or next to any parking meter shall park within the lines or markings so established.

No person shall park any vehicle across any such line or marking or park the vehicle in such position that the same shall not be entirely within the area so designated by such lines or markings. Only one registered vehicle (and no other vehicle, registered or not) is permitted to park in a designated parking space.

§ 7-9.4 Non-Resident Use of Pay-By-App.

No person who is not a resident of the Borough of East Newark shall park a vehicle other than as herein shown upon any street in the Borough of East Newark without having first deposited the appropriate United States Currency through the Pay-By-App as designated by the Borough.

§ 7-9.5 Legal Parking Time Limits / Payment for Parking.

The obligation to pay for parking through the Pay-By-App shall extend 24 hours per day, seven days per week, 365 days per year, unless otherwise established by the Borough or through the exercise of emergency powers by the Mayor or the Chief of Police, as may be required. The amount paid through the Pay-By-App shall pay for all times that the vehicle is parked in the Borough. Any lapse in payment for any amount of time that a non-resident vehicle is parked on any street in the Borough shall be considered a violation of this Ordinance.

§ 7-9.6 Violations and Penalties.

Unless another penalty is expressly provided by New Jersey Statute, any person who shall violate or fail to comply with any of the provisions of this Chapter, or who shall counsel, aid or abet any such person shall be ~~an amount determined under this chapter but not exceed the penalties established under § 7-4.1 (a payable fine not to exceed \$100.00 or imprisonment for a term not to exceed five (5) days, either or both penalties may be imposed at the discretion of the court costs)~~ subject to a fine of fifty-five dollars (\$55.00) U.S. Currency. The foregoing payable amount shall have in addition court costs to be imposed if the violation is determined by the Municipal Court or any court of competent jurisdiction.

§ 7-9.7 Residential Parking Permit Holders Exempt, Exception.

Pursuant to § 7-8.10, the terms of this Section shall not apply to Residential Parking Permit holders who park in the Borough. However, any resident of the Borough who parks in a private parking lot shall first deposit the appropriate United States Currency through the Pay-By-App as designated by the Borough. Any resident who does not first deposit the appropriate United States Currency through the Pay-By-App as designated by the Borough when parking in a private parking lot shall be in violation of this Ordinance and subject to the fines and penalties herein.

§ 7-9.8 Duty of Police or Parking Enforcement Officer in Case of Overtime Parking.

It shall be the duty of any Police Officer and/or Parking Enforcement Officer employed by the Borough to enforce the provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 2.

Severability

If any section or provision of this ordinance is declared invalid for any reason whatsoever, same shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other part or portion of this ordinance.

Section 3.

Inconsistent Ordinances

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

Section 4.

This ordinance shall take effect after its final passage by the Borough Council and approval by the Mayor at the time and manner provided for and required by law.

Section 5.

On passage this ordinance shall be codified.

PUBLIC PORTION

Rodrigo Desilva - 218 Grant Ave

Mr. Desilva wished to discuss parking regulations for motorcycles within the Borough. He indicated he had heard that there was going to spots for motorcycles only and no cars would be able to share a spot with a motorcycle. He stated he had a mini cooper and wanted to know if he could no longer park the car in front of his motorcycle. By doing this, he stated he's being considerate to his neighbors by only taking up one spot instead of two.

Mr. Cifelli – The Ordinance states that you can only have one vehicle parked per spot.

Mr. Desilva indicated he understood that but if he parks his motorcycle separate, he receives damage to his motorcycle.

Mayor Grilo – There is an issue around Town regarding this. As the Borough Attorney stated, that's the Ordinance as it stands and if you haven't received a ticket, that's an enforcement issue. The issue is that not everyone is as considerate for their neighbors, which has led to a big problem where people are using motorcycles to save spots for themselves

which is incorrect and inconsiderate. This happens throughout the Borough. We are looking at potentially making designated motorcycle spots in smaller spots around the Borough.

Mr. Desilva - I have three motorcycles, but I only keep one on the street, the other two are in storage. I could easily park them all in one spot, instead of parking each of them in four different spots.

Mayor Grilo – That would not be considerate, and this is not a one size fits all solution however there are many people that don't have small cars and are doing the same thing. We appreciate you coming in to speak about this but that is the Ordinance. We are always open to potential solutions so please if you have any ideas let us know.

Councilman Sheehan – Look at the handicap spots we have in the Borough which are also being abused. There are three cars in one apartment and swop out the handicap placard for the different cars in the same spot. How do we answer that, because this is an issue and problem.

Councilwoman Zincavage – There's a spot for a motorcycle on Mulock Place, just so you're aware.

Mayor Grilo – We're looking at spaces to be able to help alleviate this issue.

Councilman Reis – There are a few undersized spots where new construction has taken place where they can't fit a regular spot so we've lost a parking spot for a car however we may be able to fit a motorcycle spot, so these are the types of spots we are looking at to create motorcycle only spots.
