§ 7-9. 15-Minute Grab & Go Business Parking Only Locations.

§ 7-9.1. Definitions.

As used in this chapter:

15-MINUTE GRAB & GO BUSINESS PARKING ONLY

Shall mean those parking spaces established herein meant for and used by customers of commercial businesses within the Borough, wherein any motor vehicle as defined by Title 39 of the New Jersey Statutes, may use any such established parking space for no more than fifteen minutes for the purpose of interacting with any commercial business within the Borough free of charge.

§ 7-9.2 Designation of 15-Minute Grab & Go Business Parking Spaces; Manner of Parking.

(a) The following are designated three (15) fifteen-minute parking locations:

- (a) No motor vehicle as defined by Title 39 of the New Jersey Statutes may park in a parking space as designated herein for more than fifteen (15) minutes. Each vehicle parked in a parking space as designated herein shall park within the lines or markings so established.
- (b) No motor vehicle as defined by Title 39 of the New Jersey Statutes may remain standing or idle while occupying any parking space designated herein at any time.
- (c) The Chief of Police (or his or her respective designee), or the Director of the Department of Public Works (or his or her respective designee), or other authorized Authority as designated by the Mayor is hereby authorized and instructed to have lines or markings painted or placed upon the curb or upon the street, or both, which controls that parking space for the purpose of designating the 15-minute Grab & Go parking space.
- (d) No person shall park any vehicle across any such line or marking or park the vehicle in such position that the same shall not be entirely within the area so designated by such lines or markings. Appropriate signage will be installed to indicate specific locations for the three (3) parking stalls next to or within a parking stall.
- (e) Subject to any other restriction within Chapter 7 of the Borough Code Titled “Traffic”, only motor vehicles as defined by Title 39 of the New Jersey Statutes may occupy a

parking space designated in this sub-chapter for the permitted time period.

(f) Residents of the Borough are not exempt from the provisions of this sub-chapter.

§ 7-9.2. Violations and Penalties.

Unless another penalty is expressly provided by New Jersey Statute, any person who shall violate or fail to comply with any of the provisions of this sub-chapter, or who shall counsel, aid or abet any such person shall be subject to a fine of fifty-five dollars (\$55.00) U.S. Currency. The foregoing payable amount shall have in addition court costs to be imposed.

§ 7-9.3. Severability.

If any section or provision of this ordinance is declared invalid for any reason whatsoever, same shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other part or portion of this ordinance.

§ 7-9.4. Inconsistent Ordinances.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

§ 7-9.5. Effective Date.

§ 7-9 Pay-by-App.

§ 7-9.1 Definitions

As used in this chapter:

PAY-BY-APP PARKING

Shall mean Mobile Payment Applications, hereinafter referred to as "Pay-by-App," used as the form of parking control along with any parking meters and kiosks (if being used as parking control devices) and Pay-by-App shall be deemed to include all forms of parking control to be operated as stated herein.

§ 7-9.2 Establishment and Operation

- a. The Borough shall establish the use of a Pay-By-App through whatever agreements are necessary and implement same consistent with the provisions herein and shall provide reasonable notice to Borough residents prior to its implementation and to non-residents after its implementation as may be required.

- b. The Borough shall designate and delineate parking zones within the borders of the Borough and may establish different rates for parking for each zone.
- c. For credit/debit card payments used to pay the fees for parking through the Pay-By-App, the Borough is hereby authorized to charge a convenience fee not to exceed \$.50 per credit/debit card transaction.
- d. The Borough is hereby authorized to charge fees to park in the Borough in an amount not to exceed \$2.00 per hour, plus any applicable convenience fees, available in increments established through the Pay-By-App.
- d.e. In addition to the Pay-By-App provisions herein, in its discretion the Borough may, through the Mayor (or his or her respective designee), provide electric meter kiosks to assist individuals for whom the Pay-By-App is not available. Fees for using any meter kiosk shall be consistent with the fees and charges in this sub-chapter. Any person using a meter kiosk is subject to all provisions of this sub-chapter.

§ 7-9.3 Marking of Spaces; Manner of Parking

The Chief of Police (or his or her respective designee), or the Director of the Department of Public Works (or his or her respective designee), or other authorized Authority as designated by the Mayor is hereby authorized and instructed to have lines or markings painted or placed upon the curb or upon the street, or both, which controls that parking space for the purpose of designating the parking space for which the Pay-By-App is to be used and each vehicle parked adjacent or next to any parking meter shall park within the lines or markings so established.

No person shall park any vehicle across any such line or marking or park the vehicle in such position that the same shall not be entirely within the area so designated by such lines or markings. Only one registered vehicle (and no other vehicle, registered or not) is permitted to park in a designated parking space.

§ 7-9.4 Non-Resident Use of Pay-By-App.

No person who is not a resident of the Borough of East Newark shall park a vehicle other than as herein shown upon any street in the Borough of East Newark without having first deposited the appropriate United States Currency through the Pay-By-App as designated by the Borough.

§ 7-9.5 Legal Parking Time Limits / Payment for Parking.

The obligation to pay for parking through the Pay-By-App shall extend 24 hours per day, seven days per week, 365 days per year, unless otherwise established by the Borough or through the exercise of emergency powers by the Mayor or the Chief of Police, as may be required. The amount paid through the Pay-By-App shall pay for all times that the vehicle is parked in the

Borough. Any lapse in payment for any amount of time that a non-resident vehicle is parked on any street in the Borough shall be considered a violation of this Ordinance.

§ 7-9.6 Violations and Penalties.

Unless another penalty is expressly provided by New Jersey Statute, any person who shall violate or fail to comply with any of the provisions of this Chapter, or who shall counsel, aid or abet any such person shall be subject to a fine of fifty-five dollars (\$55.00) U.S. Currency. The foregoing payable amount shall have in addition court costs to be imposed.

§ 7-9.7 Residential Parking Permit Holders Exempt, Exception.

Pursuant to § 7-8.10, the terms of this Section shall not apply to Residential Parking Permit holders who park in the Borough. However, any resident of the Borough who parks in a private parking lot shall first deposit the appropriate United States Currency through the Pay-By-App as designated by the Borough. Any resident who does not first deposit the appropriate United States Currency through the Pay-By-App as designated by the Borough when parking in a private parking lot shall be in violation of this Ordinance and subject to the fines and penalties herein.

§ 7-9.8 Duty of Police or Parking Enforcement Officer in Case of Overtime Parking.

It shall be the duty of any Police Officer and/or Parking Enforcement Officer employed by the Borough to enforce the provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 2.

Severability

If any section or provision of this ordinance is declared invalid for any reason whatsoever, same shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other part or portion of this ordinance.

Section 3.

Inconsistent Ordinances

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

Section 4.

§ 20-5.11. Required Notification.

- a. Once a year, the Construction Code Official shall notify public utility providers and municipalities of planned work on Borough roads. Any work to be done on these roads will have to be done before paving is started. Such notice shall state that no road opening permit shall be issued for openings, cuts or excavations in such Borough road for a period of 5 years after the date of paving. The notice shall also notify such permittee that applications for road opening permits, for work to be done prior to such paving shall be submitted promptly in order that the work covered by the permit may be completed before paving.
- b. During such five-year period, no permit shall be issued to open, cut or excavate in such Borough road unless, in the judgment of the Construction Code Official, an emergency exists which makes it absolutely essential that the road opening permit be issued.
- c. The Construction Code Official is authorized to demand a cash escrow or equivalent in an amount not exceeding \$10,000 to assure that any road opening on roadways paved within the past 5 years is restored satisfactorily. The restoration shall include milling and repaving of the area so as to blend uniformly with the adjacent roadway as per the conditions stated in the permit, including restoration of pavement markings, signage and all other appurtenances.

Chapter 27. Parks and Playgrounds.

§ 27-1. CARE AND PROTECTION OF PARKS. [Ord. No. 03-08 § 1]

§ 27-1.1 Definitions.

Whenever the term "parks" is used in this chapter, it shall be taken to include each and every park under the jurisdiction of the Borough of East Newark.

§ 27-1.2 Prohibited Conduct and Activities.

[Ord. No. 03-08 §§ 2 — 21; Ord. No. 02-09 §§ 1, 3; Ord. No. 06-12]

As it pertains to any park within, in whole or in part, the boundaries of the Borough of East Newark:

- a.** No person shall cut, break, deface, defile, damage, misuse or abuse any building, fence, equipment, tree, bush, flower, plant or turf or other thing situated in the parks.
- b.** No person within the parks, unless expressly authorized by the Borough of East Newark, shall:
 - 1.** Throw a stone or other missile or launch any model rocket, airplane or any projectile.
 - 2.** Have possession of or engage in the explosion of any firecracker, explosive or firework or otherwise create any open fires.
 - 3.** Sell, expose for sale or give away goods, wares or circulars.
 - 4.** Post or display any sign, placard or advertising device.
 - 5.** Solicit any subscription or contribution or engage in any fundraising without the appropriate approvals from the borough.
 - 6.** Play, engage or take part in any game or competitive sport for money or other valuable thing.
 - 7.** Play any game of chance.
 - 8.** Have possession of any instrument or device for gambling.
 - 9.** Bring or have in his possession any air gun, spring gun, sling shot or other

instrument or weapon in which the propelling force is a spring of air.

10. Smoke, chew, consume or otherwise use any tobacco products, or any product containing tetrahydrocannabinol (commonly referred to as “THC”).
 11. Sell or offer for sale any object or merchandise or any other item within the parks or playgrounds or place any other equipment or apparatus within the parks or playgrounds.
 12. Use a personal grill or device or equipment designed for the cooking or preparation of food for any purpose.
 13. Climb any structure within any park other than a structure designed for climbing.
- c. No person, club or organization of any kind shall hold any meeting, carnival, exhibition or performance of any kind without obtaining written permission of the Borough of East Newark.
 - d. A permit to do any act shall authorize the same only insofar as it may be performed in strict accordance with the terms and conditions thereof. Any violation by its holder or his agents or employees of any term or condition thereof, shall constitute grounds for its revocation by the Borough of East Newark, or its authorized representative: In case of a breach of any permit, all monies paid for on account thereof shall be forfeited to and retained by the Borough of East Newark.
 - e. No person except an employee of the Borough of East Newark, within the parks, shall go within the shrubbery or climb a tree, and no person shall sit or stand on a balustrade, wall or fence, or stand or lie down on a bench.
 - f. No person within the parks, except in a place provided therefor and only at such times and under such regulations as the Borough of East Newark may prescribe, shall place, throw or drain any offensive substance into the water, including the Passaic River. Animals Running at Large. No domestic animals shall be allowed to run at large within the parks, and all persons taking dogs into the parks shall hold them with a leash, which leash shall be no longer than five feet in length. All such dogs shall bear a current license issued by the municipality in which the owner resides. Any dogs running at large within the parks or any dogs not bearing a current license may be impounded. The owner or keeper of a dog shall at all times while the dog is in the park, prevent its defecation to be left on the ground and shall immediately remove the same and dispose of it in a sanitary manner.
 - g. No person shall make use of any drinking fountains within the area of the parks for dogs or other animals. The purpose of said drinking fountains is for human consumption only.
 - h. Veterans Park Soccer Field and Riverfront Park.
 1. No person age 13 and over shall be permitted on Veterans Park Soccer Field or the playground within Riverfront Park unless supervising a younger person or

allowed by permit issued pursuant to this chapter.

2. No person age 10 and over shall be permitted to utilize the equipment at the playground adjacent to Veterans Park Soccer Field or at the playground within Riverfront Park.
 3. No person allowed in Veterans Park Soccer Field, the playground adjacent to Veteran's Park Soccer Field, or the playground within Riverfront Park under the age of six without guardian.
- i. Use of Motorized Vehicles, Scooters, Rollerblades or Skateboards. No person shall operate any vehicles of the type known as mini-bikes, electric or motorized bikes, electric or motorized skateboards or scooters, mopeds, or snowmobiles anywhere within the parks.
 - j. Garbage and Trash. No person shall dump any fill, building materials, garbage, waste or trash within the parks, including the Passaic River adjacent to Riverfront Park, without the written permission of the Borough of East Newark, and no person shall drop, place or throw any paper, refuse or debris of any nature anywhere within the parks except in a place provided for their reception.
 - k. Loitering. The term "loitering" as defined in this chapter shall mean remaining idle in essentially one location and shall include the concept of spending time idly, loafing, or walking about aimlessly and shall also include the colloquial expression "Hanging Around."
1. No person shall loiter in a public place in such a manner as to:
 - (a) Create or cause to be created a danger or a breach of the peace.
 - (b) Create or cause to be created any disturbance or annoyance to the comfort and repose of any person.
 - (c) Obstruct the free passage of pedestrians.
 - (d) Obstruct, molest or interfere with any person or group of persons lawfully within the parks. This shall include the making of unsolicited remarks of an offensive, disgusting or insulting nature or which are calculated to annoy or disturb the person to, or in whose hearing, they are made.
 - (e) Be, at any time, between the hours of 8:00 p.m. and sunrise, within the confines of the Borough of East Newark.
 - (f) Be, at any location within any Park within the Borough where there is no artificial lighting between 1/2 hour after sunset and 8:00 a.m.

None of the above prohibitions shall apply to leased concession areas excepting where the lessee, for good cause, requests the removal of disorderly persons.
 2. Discretion of Police Officer. Whenever any Police Officer or any duly delegated law enforcement persons, shall, in the exercise of reasonable judgment, decide that the presence of any person or group of persons within any Park within the

Borough is causing or is likely to cause any of the conditions enumerated in paragraph 1, above, he shall, if he deems it necessary for the preservation of the public peace and safety, order that person or group of persons to leave the park. Any person who shall refuse to leave the park after being ordered to do so by a Police Officer shall be guilty of a violation of this chapter.

3. The Borough of East Newark, through its Mayor or his/her authorized representative, the Chief of Police or his/her authorized representative, shall have the authority to close any park or parks or any section of a park or parks during the time of any civil disorder within the parks or surrounding areas, or for the reason that it may be deemed necessary in the interest of the public safety and may impose a curfew as an emergency measure to keep order in the park or parks. The curfew shall remain in force, or a section of the park may be declared closed to the public for the period of the disorder or emergency or until such time as the Borough determines.
 - l. No person operating a taxicab or other vehicle for hire, shall solicit any passenger within the limits of the parks.
 - m. Alcoholic Beverages. No person shall drink, take, sell, buy, use or have possession of or be under the influence of any intoxicating liquors while within the limits of the parks. This section shall not apply to any leased concession properly licensed by law.
 - n. No person shall destroy, remove or carry away or have possession of any building, fence, tree, bush, plant or any part thereof, turf or other property belonging to the Borough of East Newark.
 - o. No person except by direction of the Borough of East Newark, shall shoot, kill, ensnare, entrap or capture any wild animal or bird within the limits of the parks, nor shall be disturb or frighten them unnecessarily or drive or attempt to drive them out of the said parks.
 - p. No person except by direction of the Borough of East Newark, shall shoot, kill, ensnare, entrap or capture any wild animal or bird within the limits of the parks, nor shall be disturb or frighten them unnecessarily or drive or attempt to drive them out of the said parks.
 - q. No person shall be permitted to cut into, destroy or remove any curbing, roadway, sidewalks or paths, and no person shall erect any tent, stand or other structure within, the parks without written permission of the Borough of East Newark.
 - r. No person shall bring, land or cause to descend or alight within or upon the parks any aircraft, drone, balloon, parachute or other apparatus for aviation, except in an extreme emergency or by express permission of the Borough of East Newark.
 - s. No person shall coast with sleds, wagons, or carts, nor shall any person throw, cast, catch, kick or strike any baseball, football or basketball, or engage in any sport or other activity except in places designated therefor; and no person shall operate any radio-

controlled or gas-operated model airplane, rocket or other flying models however propelled.

- t. No person except those authorized by law shall have possession of any firearm, and no person except a police officer in the performance of his/her official duty shall discharge any firearm. Nothing contained herein shall prohibit the lawful use of firearms in a place which may be established by authorization of the Borough of East Newark as a pistol or target range.
- u. No person shall shoot, kill, ensnare, entrap or capture any fish or marine life animal or bird within the limits of the parks, including the Passaic River adjacent to Riverfront Park, nor shall any person disturb or frighten them unnecessarily or drive or attempt to drive them out of the said parks or waterway.
- v. No person shall launch from or dock at, any boat, kayak or watercraft in the Passaic River at or from the walkway or pier in Riverfront Park. No person shall ascend or descend to or from any boat, kayak or watercraft in the Passaic River from any location within Riverfront Park.
- w. No person over the age of 18 shall allow any person age 13 or under to be unaccompanied while on the walkway or pier adjacent to the Passaic River in Riverfront Park.
- x. No person shall obstruct any entrance or exit in any park.
- y. No person shall take any photograph or video in any park for commercial purposes without a permit. This prohibition does not include any photograph or video taken for use on social media.
- z. No person shall destroy or damage any structure within any park, including damage to any camera, speaker, plant, tree, shrub, flower, or ground. No person shall damage or use for a non-emergent reason, any emergency broadcast or emergency communication device, including any emergency towers.
- aa. The list of prohibited activities in this chapter is not exhaustive and can include any activities or conduct prohibited by any other applicable ordinance, regulation, code or law.

§ 27-1.3 Closing of Parks.

[Ord. No. 03-08 § 22]

The Mayor, or his/her authorized representative, following consultation with the Police, is hereby authorized to close any section or part of any park, and for such time periods in his discretion, providing such closing shall be in the best interests of the public using said Parks and the security of the Parks.

The following guidelines for the exercise of discretion by the Mayor, or his/her authorized

representative, shall include but shall not be limited to, the following:

- a. At such times and for such periods as may be required to enable persons engaged in any other type of athletic activity to more safely pursue such activities.
- b. At such times and for such periods as may be required to permit parades, carnivals, concerts and other public activities to take place within the confines of the park.
- c. At such times and for such periods as may be required to preserve the health, safety and general welfare of persons using the park and the security of any Park in the Borough.

§ 27-1.4 Permits.

[Ord. No. 03-08 §§ 23, 25-29]

All permits and special permission for exemptions from any rules and regulations as set forth herein, shall be issued by the Mayor and Borough Council.

- a. Application. A person seeking issuance of a permit shall file an application with the Office of the Borough. The application shall state:
 1. Name and address of applicant.
 2. Name and address of the person, persons, corporation or association sponsoring the activity.
 3. The day and hours for which the permit is desired.
 4. The park or a portion thereof, for which such permit is sought.
 5. Estimate of anticipated attendance.
 6. Any other information necessary to determine whether or not a permit is to be issued.
- b. Conditions for Issuance. The permit is to be issued:
 1. When the proposed activity or use of the park will not unreasonably interfere with or detract from the general public enjoyment of the park.
 2. When the proposed activity and use will not unreasonably interfere with or detract from the promotion of public health, welfare, safety and recreation.
 3. When the proposed activity or use is not reasonably anticipated to incite violence, crime, or disorderly conduct.
 4. When the proposed activity will not entail unusual, extraordinary or burdensome expense or police operation by the Borough.
 5. When the facilities desired have not been reserved for some other use at the day and hour requested in application.

6. When a Certificate of Insurance is submitted in form and amount acceptable by the Borough.
- c. Applicability of Rules and Regulations. The permittee shall be bound by all park rules and regulations and all ordinances as though the same were fully set forth in the permit and shall exhibit the same upon request of any authorized person.
- d. The person or persons to whom a permit is issued shall be liable for any loss, damage or injury sustained by any person whatsoever by reason of the negligence of the person or persons to whom such permit shall have been issued. The Borough of East Newark shall not be liable in such instances.
- e. The Borough of East Newark shall have the authority to revoke a permit upon a finding of violation of any rule or ordinance or upon good cause.
- f. No person in a park shall disturb or interfere unreasonably with any person or party occupying any area or participating in any activity under authority of a valid permit or any party simply making valid use of park facilities.
- g. The Borough of East Newark shall have the authority to seize and confiscate any property, thing or device in the park, or used, in violation of any applicable ordinance or statute.
- h. Fees for permits and for admission to the parks program and activities may be charged as authorized by the Mayor and Borough Council.

§ 27-1.5 Synthetic Fields.

[Ord. No. 03-08 § 24]

- a. No spectator, player, runner nor any person whatsoever shall at any time enter upon any synthetic field while wearing metal and/or plastic spiked or cleated foot gear.
- b. No spectator, player, runner nor any person whatsoever shall bring into a synthetic field of play pumpkin or sunflower seeds, chewing gum, chewing tobacco, smokeless tobacco, nor shall any person expectorate on a synthetic field.
- c. Any person pleading guilty to or having been found guilty of any infraction of this subsection **27-1.5** may in addition to the penalties stated in subsection 27-1.10, herein be barred from using any Borough synthetic field for up to one year.
- d. If any team or league is found to have had one or more of its players in violation of this subsection **27-1.5** on more than three occasions in any calendar year then any permit held by such team or league shall be revoked pursuant to subsection **17-1.5** of this chapter.

§ 27-1.6. Hours of Operation.

[Ord. No. 03-08 § 30]

Except for unusual and unforeseen emergencies, parks shall be open to the public every day of the year during designated hours. The opening and closing hours for each individual park shall be posted therein for public information. No person shall be in any Borough public park or playground before daybreak or after 8:00 p.m., except as provided by the Mayor and Borough Council.

§ 27-1.7 Bicycles.

[Ord. No. 03-08 § 31]

No person shall ride a bicycle on other than a paved vehicle road or path designated for that purpose. A bicyclist is permitted to push a bicycle by hand over any wooded trail or on any paved area reserved for pedestrian use.

§ 27-1.8 Authority of Park Personnel.

[Ord. No. 03-08 § 32]

No person in a park or in the immediate vicinity thereof about to enter a park shall fail to obey all authorized personnel.

§ 27-1.9 Sleeping on Benches; Disorderly Conduct.

[Ord. No. 02-09 § 2]

While in the Borough's parks, all persons shall conduct themselves in a proper and orderly manner and, in particular, no person shall sleep on the seats, benches or other areas within the parks or engage in loud, boisterous, threatening, abusive, insulting or indecent language or engage in any disorderly conduct or behavior tending to breach the public peace.

§ 27-1.10. Penalties.

[Ord. No. 03-08 § 33]

Any person convicted of violating a provision of the Ordinance before a Court of competent jurisdiction, shall be subject to the penalties set forth in Chapter 1, Section 1-5 of these Revised General Ordinances, but not shall not be less than \$500.00 per occurrence.

ORDINANCE

BOROUGH OF EAST NEWARK COUNTY OF HUDSON, STATE OF NEW JERSEY

ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF EAST NEWARK AMENDING CHAPTER 6 TITLED "ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CONTROL" SPECIFICALLY BY AMENDING CHAPTER 6 SECTIONS RELATED TO FEES, HOURS OF OPERATION AND PENALTIES.

§ 6-1. PURPOSE. [1985 Code § 6-1]

This chapter is enacted to regulate the sale and transportation of alcoholic beverages in the Borough of East Newark in accordance with the provisions of an act of the Legislature of the State of New Jersey entitled "An Act Concerning Alcoholic Beverages," comprising Chapter 436 of the Laws of 1933, its supplements and amendments, and also comprising N.J.S.A. 33:1-1 et seq., and in accordance with the rules and regulations of the State Director of Alcoholic Beverage Control.

§ 6-2. DEFINITIONS. [1985 Code § 6-2]

For the purpose of this chapter, words and phrases herein shall have the same meanings as in N.J.S.A. 33:1-1 et seq., and the rules and regulations of the Director of the Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control.

§ 6-3. LICENSES.

§ 6-3.1. Laws Applicable. [1985 Code § 6-3.1]

All applications for licenses, all licenses issued and all proceedings under this chapter shall be in accordance with the act, rules and regulations referred to in Section 6-1, and all other applicable laws of the State of New Jersey or the United States.

§ 6-3.2. Issuing Authority. [1985 Code § 6-3.2]

All licenses required by this chapter shall be issued by the Mayor and Council, which shall also administer the provisions of this chapter.

§ 6-3.3. License Required. [1985 Code § 6-3.3]

No person shall sell or distribute alcoholic beverages within the Borough without obtaining a license in accordance with the act referred to in Section 6-1 and the provisions of this chapter.

§ 6-3.4. License Fees. [1985 Code § 6-3.4; Ord. 2/15/90; amended 12-9-2020 by Ord. No. 15-2020]

The annual fees of licenses for the sale and distribution of alcoholic beverages in the Borough shall be as follows:

Class of License	Annual License Fee
Plenary Retail Consumption License	\$1,500.00
Limited Retail Distribution License	\$250.00
Plenary Retail Distribution License	\$1,500.00
Transfer of License (Person-to-Person or Place-to-Place)	\$500.00

§ 6-3.4.a Term of license.

A license shall be for the term of one year, from the first day of July in each year.

§ 6-3.4.b Fee to accompany application.

Every application for a license shall be accompanied by a deposit of the full amount of the properly prorated annual fee for such license.

§ 6-3.4.c Filing of applications

All applications for licenses as hereinbefore set forth shall be filed with the Town Clerk of the Borough of East Newark.

§ 6-3.4.d Application fee.

The Town Clerk be and he hereby is authorized to charge an application fee of \$100.00 to each

applicant for a liquor license application, and said fee shall be payable upon issuance to the applicant of the appropriate forms to be completed by the applicant.

§ 6-3.4.e Limitations of licenses

The provisions of this subsection with respect to the limitation on the number of licenses shall not apply to the renewal or transfer of licenses presently issued.

The provisions of New Jersey's State Limitation Law, as provided in Chapter 72 of the Laws of 1960 and as the same may be hereafter amended, shall control the number of and the issuance of plenary retail consumption licenses and plenary retail distribution licenses.

§ 6-4. REGULATIONS OF LICENSES.

§ 6-4.1. Hours of Sale. [1985 Code § 6-4.1]

No alcoholic beverages shall be sold, delivered or served to or consumed in any licensed premises on any day between the hours of 12:00 a.m. and 12:00 p.m., except Sundays as hereinafter provided.

§ 6-4.2. Sundays. [1985 Code § 6-4.2]

Provisions of subsection 6-4.1 shall not apply on Sundays. On Sundays, no alcoholic beverages may be sold, served, delivered to or consumed in the licensed premises between the hours of 12:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. § 6-4.3. New Year's Day. [1985 Code § 6-4.3]

§ 6-4.3. New Year's Day. [1985 Code § 6-4.3]

Deleted.

§ 6-4.4. Sales to Certain Persons. [1985 Code § 6-4.4]

No licensee or employee of a licensee shall sell, serve or deliver, directly or indirectly, any alcoholic beverages to any intoxicated person or person under the legal age, nor permit the consumption of alcoholic beverages on any licensed premises by any of the above named classes or persons, or permit any such persons to congregate in or about the licensed premises.

§ 6-4.5. Closing Provisions; Exceptions. [1985 Code § 6-4.5]

During the hours in which sales of alcoholic beverages are hereinabove prohibited, the entire licensed premises shall also be closed and no person shall be admitted or permitted to remain therein except the licensee or bona fide employees of the licensee. Any food service establishment, duly permitted and/or licensed, may be open for food service only beginning at 8:00 a.m.

§ 6-4.6. Hiring of Minors

No licensee shall have in his employ anyone under the age of 18 years.

§ 6-4.7. Bulk supplies prohibited.

No licensee shall have, keep or possess at any time on the licensed premises, any distilled or fortified or rectified or blended alcoholic beverages whatsoever, in bulk. No alcoholic beverage shall be sold to be consumed on the licensed premises unless the same shall be taken out of original containers properly sealed with all necessary government and state stamps affixed thereto. All alcoholic beverages sold to be consumed off the premises shall be sold in original containers properly sealed with all necessary government and state stamps affixed thereto.

§ 6-4.8. Consumption on premises prohibited.

No such half-pint, pint or quart of distilled alcoholic beverages shall be sold on the licensed premises for consumption thereon but may be sold for consumption off a duly retail distribution licensed premises.

§ 6-4.9. Open containers to be retained.

Following every sale of distilled or fortified or rectified or blended alcoholic beverages, for consumption on the licensed premises, each licensee shall retain upon the licensed premises all containers so sold with the broken seal and stamps thereon until written permission of the Department of Public Safety is given for the removal thereof, whereon said last-mentioned containers shall forthwith be removed.

§ 6-4.10. Stamps required on all bottles.

If any containers, filled, partly filled or empty, shall be found upon the licensed premises of any licensee without all lawful and proper stamps attached thereto or with forged, counterfeit or in any otherwise unlawful stamps or if such stamps, whether attached to any container or not, shall be found upon such licensed premises, then and in either of such events this license may be immediately revoked.⁶

§ 6-4.11. Change of rules and regulations.

All licenses issued under these rules and regulations shall be subject to the right hereby reserved by the Borough to change, alter, amend or repeal the same at any time.

§ 6-7. IDENTIFICATION and CERTIFICATION OF BARTENDERS, WAITERS or WAITRESSES.

§ 6-7.1. Annual Registration required; fingerprints; photograph. [1985 Code § 6-7.1]

All staff, including each bartender, waiter, waitress or any employee who plans to be employed by a licensee approved by the State of New Jersey Division of Alcohol and Beverage Control shall

register and make application in writing on forms supplied by the East Newark Police Department to all questions as to the identity, character, previous employment, criminal record and general experience of the bartender, waiter or waitress or other employee. He or she shall submit to the taking by the Police Department of the Borough of East Newark of fingerprint impressions, a criminal background check, and shall furnish to the East Newark Police Department four photographs of himself or herself for each certificate for which an application is being submitted. The photographs shall be of a size of two inches by two inches. They shall be satisfactory to the East Newark Police Department and shall have been taken within one year of the date of submission. In addition, he or she shall present a valid driver's license or other valid government-issued form of identification and proof of current address in a form as required by the East Newark Police Department. At the time of the initial filing of an application, a temporary certificate shall be issued. This temporary certificate will be valid for a period not to exceed three months. On or before this time and after it is found that no criminal history would preclude employment, a certificate shall be issued for a period, not to exceed one year, as listed in this article.

§ 6-7.2. [1985 Code § 6-7.2] Rosters

Any licensee holding a Plenary Retail Consumption License in the Borough shall create and maintain for inspection by the East Newark Police Department, a current roster of each bartender, waiter, waitress or employee in its employ.

§ 6-7.3. Upon the issuance of a certificate (“bar card”).

After the License Inspector of the East Newark Police Department or any such person as designated by the Director of Public Safety and/or the Chief of Police has deemed through a criminal history check, that the bartender, waiter or waitress or any employee employed by the licensee approved by the State of New Jersey Division of Alcohol and Beverage Control is legally able to possess a certificate or bar card, same shall be issued authorizing employment in a specified establishment. The certificate or bar card shall be presented by the person making application to the premises of employment and shall be posted, as prescribed by the rules and regulations of the State of New Jersey Division of Alcohol and Beverage Control. A photostatic copy shall be kept on the person of the individual for whom the certificate is assigned. In addition, the employer of the individual certificate holder shall be required to post the original certificates of all employees in a conspicuous manner as prescribed by the rules and regulation of the State of New Jersey Division of Alcohol and Beverage Control.

§ 6-7.4. Hiring of unregistered employees prohibited; registration of new employees.

No licensed establishment as mentioned in herein shall employ any bartender, waiter or waitress or any employee connected with or employed by the licensee unless he or she shall have complied with the provisions of all sections of this article. No licensed establishment shall employ any new bartender, waiter, waitress or any employee connected with or employed by the licensee in connection with the licensed premises unless, prior to the commencement of his or her employment, he or she shall have complied with all the provisions of this article.

§ 6-7.5. Violations. [1985 Code § 6-7.5]

The identification card mentioned above shall be revocable by the Police Department for any violations of the regulations and rules of the Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control, and for any good cause which might have caused the Police Department to refuse the issuance of the card under the provisions of subsection 6-7.3.

§ 6-7.6. Penalty. [1985 Code § 6-7.6]

Any person or entity subject to the provisions in this Chapter violating any of the provisions of this section shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a penalty as set forth in Section 1-5 and shall be subject to such other penalties as shall be prescribed by the rules and regulations of the Director of the Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control.

§ 6-7.7. Revocation of certificates.

Certificates issued under the provisions of this article may be revoked by the East Newark Police Department for any of the following reasons:

- A.** Fraud, misrepresentation or falsifying a statement contained in the application for a certificate.
- B.** A violation of regulations and rules of the State of New Jersey Division of Alcohol and Beverages Control.
- C.** Any violation of this article.

§ 6-7.8. Appeals.

Any person aggrieved by the action of the office of the License Inspector of the East Newark Police Department in the denial of an application for certificate as provided for in this article shall have the right of appeal to the Council of the Borough of East Newark or an appointed panel. Such appeal shall be filed with the Town Clerk of the Municipality of East Newark within 14 days after having been advised verbally or by mail to the last known residence. The notices of appeal shall contain a written statement setting forth completely the grounds for the appeal. The Clerk of the

Borough of East Newark shall set a time and place for a hearing of such an appeal and notice of such hearing shall be given to the appellant by certified mail. Said hearing shall take place within 30 days of the individual being advised. The decision and order of the Borough Council or its assigned panel shall be final and conclusive.

§ 6-7.9. Fees.

The fee for a certificate or bar card for all employees, including all bartenders, waiters or waitresses or any employee connected with, or employed by or to be connected with or employed by a licensed establishment shall be paid to the office of the License Inspector of the East Newark Police Department at the time of the filing of written application for the certificate for bartenders, waiters or waitresses or any employee who plans to be employed by the licensed establishment or renewal thereof, and shall be in the amount of \$ 75.00, which amount includes the processing activities described in section §6-7.1 above and the issuance of a certificate or bar card as described in §6-7.3 above. Further, a money order made out to "The Division of the State Police - SBI" in the amount as required by the State of New Jersey must be submitted to the East Newark Police Department.

§ 6-7.10. Certificate to apply to single place of employment.

Each certificate shall pertain to employment only on the premises for which it is issued and shall be returned to the East Newark Police Department by the licensee of the premises for which it is issued at the termination of the employment of the individual whom it identifies.

§ 6-7.11. Term of certificate.

Each certificate for bartenders, waiters or waitresses or any employee connected with or employed by the licensee shall cover the calendar year commencing July 1 and ending June 30. Applications for renewal shall be made no later than May 31 in each year.

Each bartender, waiter, waitress or employee hired after July 1, 2025, by a licensee holding a Plenary Retail Consumption License in the Borough shall, within 30 days of hiring, shall tender his or her application as proscribed herein to the East Newark Police Department.

§ 6-7.12. Violations and penalties; Enforcement

Any person, firm, partnership or corporation violating any of the provisions of the article shall, upon conviction, pay a fine not exceeding the sum of \$1,000 or shall suffer imprisonment in the county jail for not more than 90 days, or both, at the discretion of the Judge of the Municipal Court. He or she shall be subject to such other penalties as shall be prescribed by the rules and regulations of the Director of the State of New Jersey Division of Alcohol and Beverage Control.

The provisions of this article shall be enforceable by the Director of Public Safety, the Chief of Police or his or her designee.

§ 6-7.13. Amendments.

All privileges granted under this Article shall be subject to the right reserved by the Borough of East Newark to change, alter or amend said Article at any time.
